During the War of Greek Independence (1821-29) Sámos revolted against Turkey and gained its freedom, but in 1832 it was handed back to Turkey to be administered by a Turkish-appointed Greek governor. Annexation to Greece came in 1912 after a brief bombardment by two Italian warships caused the Turks to evacuate.
