Use an appropriate group grading strategy: have teaching assistants grade assignments for students not in their section or lab to curb favoritism (N.B. this strategy puts the emphasis on the evaluative, rather than the teaching, function of grading);

In most public school and college settings, grading uses a 100-point scale. This scale correlates letter grades (A, B, C, and D) with ten-point ranges on this scale. An "F" (or "E" depending on the language used at your particular institution) is conferred

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for a score anywhere between 0 and 59%.
