Only have to has a past and a future form. Must does not have a past or a future form. Yesterday, I had to take a taxi. (NOT Yesterday, I must take a taxi)

have to, don't have to, must, mustn't - Test-English

must/mustn't. Use must + infinitive without to. Must is a modal verb, and modal verbs are followed by infinitive without to. I must go to the doctor. (NOT I must to go to the doctor.) No -s. Modal verbs don't add -s after he/she/it. He must come with us. (NOT He must comes with us.)

have to, don't have to, must, mustn't - Test-English

1. The use of must, must not (mustn't) and need not (needn't) The modals must, must not and need not have the same form regardless the subject. There is no ending with he/she/it. If you want to say the sth. is unnecessary, use need not, not must not. (The negation of must means not allowed to.) I must play football. = I have to play football.

In this lesson we look at have to, must and must not, followed by a quiz to check your understanding. have to for objective obligation. We often use have to to say that something is obligatory, for example: Children have to go to school.
